They beat the beast off with bricks and stones. and it attacked Billings and grabbed him by the right arm and could not be shaken off. Billings downed the brute and choked it until it loosened its hold. In the meantime Thomas had secured a hatchet and endeavored to kill the dog. but failed, and the animal attacked and bit him. Billings picked up the hatchet and came to his rescue, when the animal broke away and again attacked the boy, who had staggered out upon the walk. He knocked the lad down, tore his ear, neck, side and thigh in a horrible manner. Billings again struck the dog with the hatchet, and a fearful flight ensued, he being bitten repeatedly, but he literally cut the Senato brute to places.
